Ms. KORZENIOWSKI moved:

Resolution No. 2: Celebration of the 60th Anniversary of VE-Day

WHEREAS World War II was declared on September 3, 1939 by Britain and France against Germany after they invaded Poland; and

WHEREAS the war eventually encompassed Europe, Asia, Africa, and the far-flung islands of the Pacific as well; and

WHEREAS the war was the greatest and most destructive war in history which strained the economic capabilities of major nations and left many countries on the edge of collapse; and

WHEREAS more than an estimated 17 million members of the armed forces of the various belligerents perished during the conflict; and

WHEREAS in the six years of conflict, Canada enlisted more than one million men and women in the armed forces with over 55,000 wounded and 45,000 giving their lives in the cause of peace and freedom; and

WHEREAS on May 7, 1945 Germany surrendered and May 8th was declared V-E day (Victory in Europe).

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba, in celebration of the 60th anniversary of VE-Day, express on behalf of all Manitobans, our deepest sympathies and thanks for the sacrifices of those Canadians who joined the forces and those that supported the war effort on home base; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Assembly call on all generations and governments to be involved in the ongoing struggle for world peace and social justice.

And the Question being put. It was agreed to, unanimously.

The following petitions were presented and read:

Mr. SCHULER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Provincial Government to consider providing East St. Paul with local ambulance service which would service both East and West St. Paul and to consider improving the way that ambulance service is supplied to all Manitoba's by utilizing technologies such as GPS in conjunction with a Medical Transportation Co-ordination Center (MTCC) which will ensure that patients receive the nearest ambulance in the least amount of time and to consider ensuring that appropriate funding is provided to maintain superior response times and sustainable services. Mr. LAMOUREUX – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Provincial Government to consider adopting generally accepted accounting principles in reporting Manitoba's budgetary numbers. (N. Arnuco, E. Maglanque, L. Maglanque)

Hon. Ms. ALLAN, the Minister of Labour and Immigration made a statement recognizing April 28th as the national day of mourning for those who have died in the workplace,

Mr. SCHULER and, by leave, Hon. Mr. GERRARD commented on the statement.
