On motion of Hon. Mr. GERRARD, Bill (No. 230) – The Mental Health Bill of Rights/Déclaration des droits des personnes ayant une maladie mentale, was read a First Time and had its purposes outlined.

The following petitions were presented and read:

Mr. DYCK – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Minister of Health to strongly consider giving priority for funding to develop and staff a new 100 bed long-term-care facility so that clients are not exposed to unsafe conditions and so that Boundary Trails Health Centre beds remain available for acute care patients instead of waiting placement clients. (R. Schwarz, D. Wiebe, D. Dueck and others)

Mr. LAMOUREUX – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Premier and his NDP Government to cooperate in uncovering the truth in why the Government did not act on what it knew and to consider calling a public inquiry on the Crocus Fund Fiasco. (C. Magat, M. Cansino, A. Dela Vega and others)

Mr. GRAYDON – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Minister responsible for the administration of The Liquor Control Act to consider working with MLCC to find alternate means of addressing rising administrative costs; and to consider working with MLCC to revise the decision to implement a significant annual license fee increase; and to consider ensuring that the unique challenges faced by small businesses are better taken into account in the future. Mrs. ROWAT – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to encourage the Minister of Family Services and Housing to consider establishing “Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Day” in Manitoba in order to increase awareness, support and understanding of the difficulties faced by families who have lost an infant. (V. Paul, T. Linnell, A. Wiebe and others)

Mr. MAGUIRE – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Minister of Health to consider creating a health care environment in which doctors want to work and build their careers in Manitoba and to consider making it a priority to recruit doctors to southwestern Manitoba so emergency rooms do not have to be closed when they are needed most. (K. Munchinsky, C. Murray, B. Johnson and others)
