In the section of the Committee of Supply sitting in the Chamber on June 24, 2013 considering the estimates of Executive Council, a voice vote was held on a motion moved by Mr. GOERTZEN recommending that the Premier's salary be reduced to \$1.08. Whereupon a count out vote was requested and Members sitting in Room 254 and Room 255 returned to the Chamber. A counted vote was held on the motion, which was defeated. (17-33)

In the section of the Committee of Supply sitting in the Chamber on June 26, 2013 considering the estimates of the Department of Family Services and Labour, a voice vote was held on a motion moved by Mrs. ROWAT recommending that the Minister's salary be reduced to \$1.08. Whereupon a count out vote was requested and Members sitting in Room 254 and Room 255 returned to the Chamber. A counted vote was held on the motion, which was defeated. (18-30)

In the section of the Committee of Supply sitting in Room 255 on June 27, 2013 considering the estimates of the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Initiatives, a voice vote was held on a motion moved by Mr. EICHLER recommending that the Minister's salary be reduced to \$1.08. Whereupon a count out vote was requested and Members sitting in Room 254 and Room 255 returned to the Chamber. A counted vote was held on the motion, which was defeated. (17-28)

In the section of the Committee of Supply sitting in Room 254 on July 2, 2013 considering the estimates of the Department of Justice, a voice vote was held on a motion moved by Mr. HELWER recommending that the Minister's salary be reduced to \$1.08. Whereupon a count out vote was requested and Members sitting in Room 254 and Room 255 returned to the Chamber. A counted vote was held on the motion, which was defeated. (19-35)

In the section of the Committee of Supply sitting in the Chamber on July 5, 2013 considering the estimates of the Department of Local Government, a voice vote was held on a motion moved by the Opposition House Leader recommending that the section of the committee rise. As per the Rules, since the Committee was sitting on a Friday and that the voice vote was not unanimous, the Chair indicated the question would be put again at the next sitting of the Committee of Supply. On July 8, the Chair ruled that no vote would be required since the motion had lapsed with the section of the Committee of Supply having risen on Friday, July 5. Whereupon the Chair's ruling was challenged and a count out vote was requested. Members sitting in Room 254 and Room 255 returned to the Chamber. A counted vote was held on the ruling, which was sustained. (33-19)

In the section of the Committee of Supply sitting in Room 254 on July 5, 2013 considering the estimates of the Department of Infrastructure and Transportation, a voice vote was held on a motion moved by Mr. EICHLER recommending that the Minister's salary be reduced to \$1.08. As per the Rules, since the voice vote was not unanimous, the chair indicated the question would be put again at the next sitting of the Committee of Supply. Whereupon a count out vote was required on July 9 and Members sitting in Room 254 and Room 255 returned to the Chamber. A counted vote was held on the motion, which was defeated. (18-30)

In the section of the Committee of Supply sitting in Room 255 on July 5, 2013 considering the estimates of the Department of Advanced Education and Literacy a voice vote was held on a motion moved by the Opposition House Leader recommending that the section of the committee rise. As per the Rules, since the Committee was sitting on a Friday and that the voice vote was not unanimous, the Chair indicated the question would be put again at the next sitting of the Committee of Supply. On July 9, the Chair ruled that no vote would be required since the motion had lapsed with the section of the Committee of Supply having risen on Friday, July 5.
