PRAYER

On motion of Ms. KLASSEN, Bill (No. 231) – The Municipal Harassment Policy Act (Various Acts Amended)/Loi sur les politiques municipales en matière de harcèlement (modification de diverses dispositions législatives), was read a First Time and had its purposes outlined.

Pursuant to Rule 27(1), Messrs. MARTIN, BINDLE, ALTEMEYER and KINEW and Hon. Mr. FLETCHER made Members' Statements.

The following petitions were presented and read:

Mrs. SMITH (Point Douglas) – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Premier of Manitoba and the Minister of Justice to immediately call a Public Inquiry into the systems that had a role in the life and death of Tina Fontaine as well as the function of the administration of justice after her death and that the terms of reference of a Public Inquiry be developed jointly with the caregivers of Tina Fontaine and/or the agent appointed by them. (T. Halcrow, R. Brass, S. Fontaine and others)

Ms. FONTAINE – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Premier of Manitoba and the Minister of Justice to immediately call a Public Inquiry into the systems that had a role in the life and death of Tina Fontaine as well as the function of the administration of justice after her death and that the terms of reference of a Public Inquiry be developed jointly with the caregivers of Tina Fontaine and/or the agent appointed by them.

Hon. Mr. FLETCHER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to take the necessary steps to ensure that the Vimy Arena site is not used for an addiction treatment facility and to take the necessary steps to ensure the preservation of public land along Sturgeon Creek for the purposes of park land and recreational activities for public use (including being an important component of the Sturgeon Creek Greenway Trail and the Sturgeon Creek ecosystem) under the current designation of PR2 for the 255 Hamilton Avenue location at the Vimy Arena site, and to maintain the land to continue to be designated for Parks and Recreation Active Neighbourhood/Community.

Hon. Mr. GERRARD – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to immediately begin implementation of plans to convert systems and forms to be more inclusive of Two-Spirit and other non-binary individuals, whether it be to include a third gender option, or no requirement for gender on forms, unless medically or statistically necessary, including health cards, and birth certificates; to immediately instruct the Manitoba Public Insurance corporation to offer a third gender option, or no gender requirement for licenses or any other form of provincial identification; to instruct Manitoba Health, Seniors and Active Living to offer the option of Manitoba Health Cards with no gender in order to reduce the anxieties of transgender and non-binary persons accessing the healthcare system as a first step; and to consider revisiting legislation that may need updating to meet the needs of its citizens in this regard. (J. Sellwood, J. Pratt. R. Wells and others)

Following Petitions, Ms. FONTAINE rose on a Matter of Privilege regarding the emergency recall of the House to consider financial matters and asked:

THAT the Speaker call the Premier and the Government to order and ensure that the proper debate on this Government Budget bill take place immediately.

And Hon. Messrs. CULLEN and GERRARD having spoken.

WHEREUPON Madam Speaker ruled there was no Matter of Privilege.

From her decision, Ms. FONTAINE appealed to the House,

And Hon. Mr. CULLEN having spoken.

THAT my privileges as a Member be honoured by providing me with a copy of the Premier's letter recalling the House as referred to in the records of this House.

WHEREUPON Madam Speaker informed the House she would take the matter under advisement.
