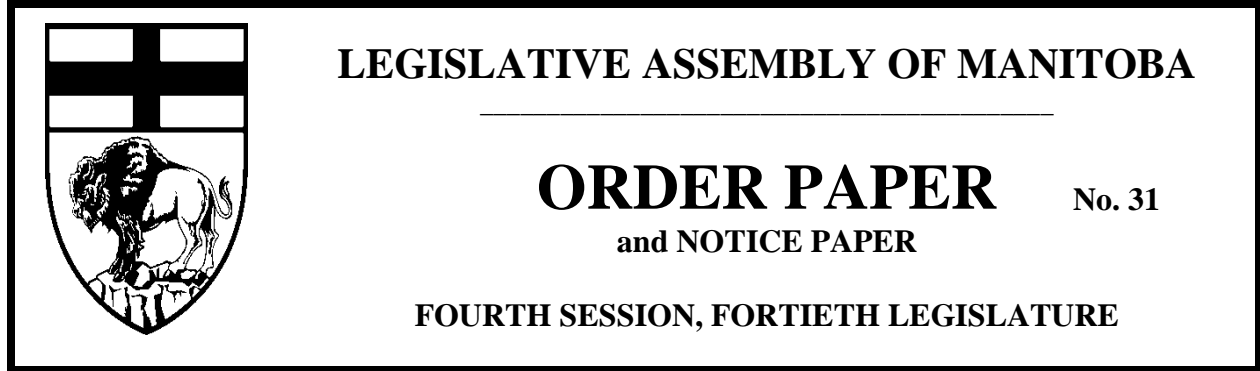

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**RESOLUTION:**

**Mr. GOERTZEN – Severance Payments Costing Manitoba Families**

2. WHEREAS in the fall of 2014 the First Minister faced a revolt from senior Members of the Provincial Government Caucus and Cabinet; and

WHEREAS the Premier agreed to a leadership contest at the NDP convention in March of 2015, which he subsequently won by only 33 votes; and

WHEREAS in a December 2014 memo to the Provincial Government political staff the First Minister's now former Chief of Staff indicated that political staff would be free to work on leadership campaigns of their choosing; and

WHEREAS according to media reports the Premier stated "*we believe everybody should be able to exercise their civil rights as citizens to participate in an electoral leadership contest*", subsequently, a number of political staff took leaves of absence to work on campaigns of their choosing; and

WHEREAS after the Premier secured his leadership by a 51 per cent to 49 per cent margin, the Premier's office began firing government staff who worked on leadership campaigns other than his own and, according to media reports the Premier stated "*people have civil rights but we also have an organization to run*"; and

WHEREAS the Premier's office offered substantial severance payments in exchange for silence of departing employees, including \$146,047 to the Premier's Chief of Staff, but have not fully disclosed all severance packages.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Government be urged to immediately release all details related to severance payments, secondment costs and leaves of absence resulting from the leadership race so that Manitobans know how much the government has paid in political payouts that cannot be used for frontline services like healthcare and education.
