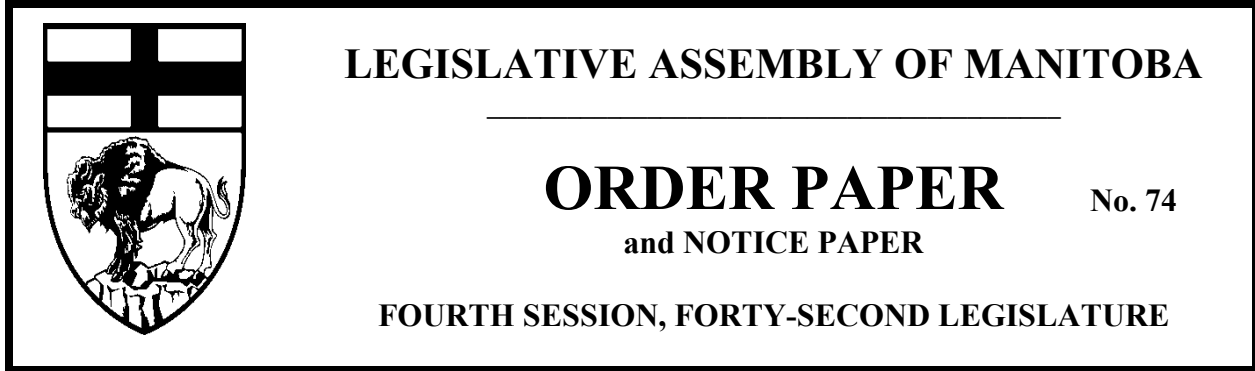

25. WHEREAS on September 16th 2022, Mahsa Amini was arrested by Iranian Police and killed as a result of the police brutality she faced; and

WHEREAS in the last 43 years, the regime has led campaigns of discrimination against women, LGBTQ community, followers of other belief systems and other ethnic minorities; and

WHEREAS since then Iranian people have taken to the streets to protest the despotic government of the Islamic Republic of Iran; and

WHEREAS the women, men, and children of Iran have shown incredible bravery and protested the dictator rule with valour; and

WHEREAS the Members of this Legislature support religious freedom and support the right for people to choose for themselves how they want to express their faith; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government stood against government intervention in the display of faith by opposing Quebec passing the Islamophobic Bill 21 in 2019; and

WHEREAS Members of this Legislature affirm that people of all faiths should have the ability to make the choice to express their religion as they see fit through ceremony or regalia; and

WHEREAS Members of this Legislature stand for freedom, justice, and all human rights; and

WHEREAS Members of this Legislature stand with the people of Iran, Mahsa Amini and all women, men, and children to have the choice of how to express their faith.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba call on the Federal Government to stand with the people of Iran and adequately support Iranians and work to protect the people of Iran.

NOTICE OF MOTION FOR THE NEXT THURSDAY OF PRIVATE MEMBERS' BUSINESS:

PROPOSED RESOLUTION:

Mr. REDHEAD – Calling on the Provincial Government to Adequately Fund the Construction of the New Aquatic Centre in Thompson

26. WHEREAS the only public pool in Thompson closed in 2019, leaving the city and surrounding communities without an aquatic facility; and

WHEREAS the closest public pool is in The Pas, a four hour drive away; and

WHEREAS Thompson has been without a public pool for the three years since the closure; and

WHEREAS on May 9th, 2022, the day before the deadline to call the Thompson by-election, the Provincial Government finally announced funding to build a new aquatic centre in Thompson; and

WHEREAS \$15 million was put forward by the Federal Government, the Provincial Government and the City of Thompson to cover the construction of the aquatic facility of which \$5 million was provincially funded; and

WHEREAS in actuality the total project cost is closer to \$20 million, meaning the province did not provide enough funding to cover what was required; and

WHEREAS this nearly \$5 million shortfall places the status of the entire project at risk; and

WHEREAS the province has offered no additional funds to make up for this shortfall; and

WHEREAS the province has not provided a timeline for when the aquatic centre will be built.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba urge the Provincial Government to adequately fund the construction of the new aquatic centre in Thompson and provide a timeline for its construction.
