

AN ORDER OF THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION
UNDER THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT ACT

**RE: THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION and MAPLE LEAF CONSTRUCTION
(1967) LTD., Applicant,**

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of The Clean Environment Act, Maple Leaf Construction (1967) Ltd. filed an application with the department of Mines, Resources and Environmental Management in connection with the operation of an asphalt batching plant located at or near 1241 St. James Street in the City of Winnipeg;

AND WHEREAS in the absence of limits being prescribed by a regulation under The Clean Environment Act, the application was referred to The Clean Environment Commission for the prescribing of limits;

AND WHEREAS no representation was made to the Commission by any person who is, or who is likely to be, affected by an order of the Commission prescribing limits in connection with the said program;

AND WHEREAS the said Commission considered the application on the 12th day of July, 1976, and again on the 9th day of August, 1976;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

1. The Applicant shall ensure that solid particulate emissions from any source or vent of the said plant are not in excess of 0.57 grams per standard cubic metre of dry undiluted gases calculated at 25 degrees Celsius and 760 millimetres of mercury.
2. The Applicant shall ensure that smoke emissions from any part of the said plant do not exhibit an opacity greater than:


2. (a) 40% for a period exceeding 4 minutes in any one-half hour nor more than 8 continuous minutes at any time;
- (b) 60% at any time.

3. The Applicant shall ensure that dust emissions from vehicle traffic and wind entrainment do not exhibit an opacity greater than five percent at any point of impingement beyond the property line of the said operation.
