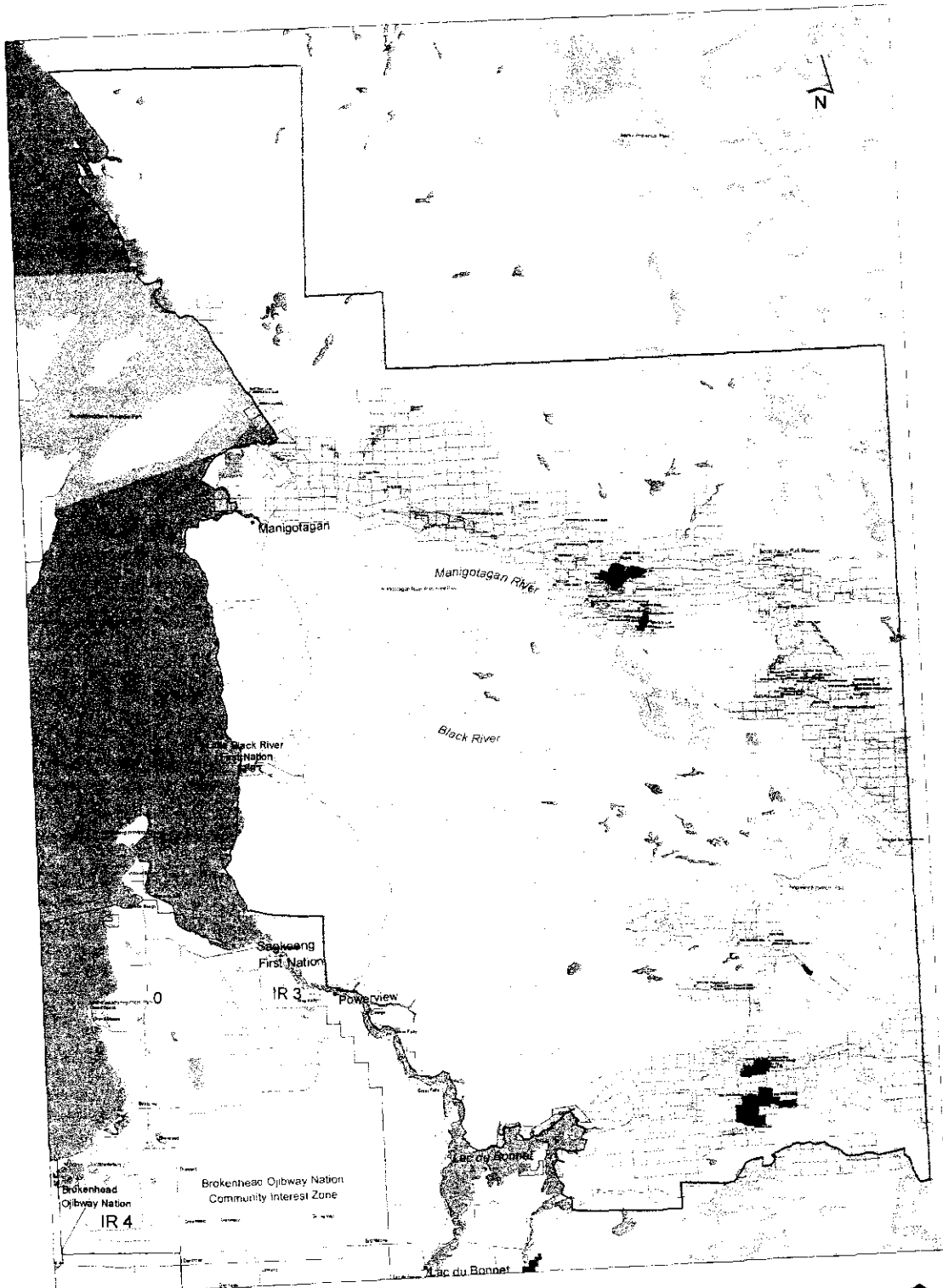

Hi Phil...enclosed for your information is a map that depicts the location of mineral dispositions that are currently in good standing under the Mines and Minerals Act. You should note that a valid mineral disposition grants the holder the legal right to access the surface of the land for mineral exploration and extraction purposes. The lands containing mineral dispositions should be documented in the FML, and surface access for mineral exploration needs to be considered on any policy for land management and possible improvements-forestry planting. The prospector's association did not have any concerns with the existing practices of forestry road closure, but had indicated that timely notification would be helpful in their exploration project planning.

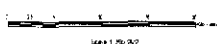
